Subject to a final decision by the licensing or permitting authority, the issuance of appropriate permits and approvals may proceed.

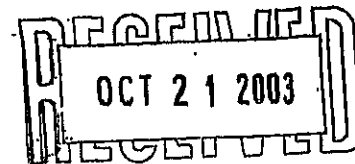

The Chair and RP have reviewed the above listed submission.

The applicant states that "[f]resh water for domestic use will be pumped directly from the river channel or trucked from a nearby lake..." but they do not identify which lake or provide access route details in the project description.

It is likely that since the barge camp has operated in several seasons, they have developed a protocol to prevent attracting and to deal with potential encounters with wildlife such as foxes and wolverines. It would be helpful to be provided with this information in the project description.


Re: Comments on the application for Amendment of Location and Renewal of Class "B" Water license N7L1-1793
